Saddlebred Three-Year-Old and Under Classics

Class #62 Park Pleasure Classic

In order to show in a UPHA Classic, all horses and ponies must be registered with their appropriate breed registry and **MUST** be shown under their registered name.

UPHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: The professional trainer of a UPHA Classic entry must be an Active member of the UPHA in good standing, and their membership number must appear on the entry blank. If a non-professional is exhibiting the horse, they must be an Associate or Junior member of the UPHA, in good standing, and their membership number must appear on the entry blank.

RULES FOR ENTERING: A non-refundable Eligibility Fee of \$50 paid to the UPHA Office postmarked on or before April 1st of each year. After April 1st, the Eligibility Fee becomes \$100 per horse. Payment of the Eligibility Fee will be made in the name of the entered horse or pony and will make that animal eligible to compete in any and all UPHA Classics classes held that year. Eligibility remains with the animal throughout the year should transfer of ownership occur. Eligibility Fees collected will be used as prize money in the UPHA Classic Grand Championships. All Eligibility Fees collected within a breed will be used in that breed's championship classes.

The entry fee for each qualifying class is \$100 and is made in two payments. The first payment, the Declaration Fee, is \$50 and must be made by the entry closing date of the particular horse show. The second payment, the Starting Fee, is also \$50 and is due 24 hours prior to the class, whenever practical. All entry fees, or partial entry fees, are added to the total purse of the class.

Horse shows may choose to host a \$250, \$500 or \$1000 Added Money Classic. The entry fee for all UPHA Classic classes is \$100 regardless of the amount of Added Money offered.

All monies collected in each Classic will be dispersed in that class. Prize money in a \$500 or \$1000 Added Money Classic is divided as follows: \$300 is deducted from the total, with \$100 going to fourth, fifth and sixth places. Of the balance, 50% is paid to first place, 30% to second place, and 20% to third place. If there were only 2 entries, the total prize money would be split 60% and 40%. If only 3 entries show, the total prize money the original percentages would apply, without the \$300 deduction. In case of only one entry, that entry would receive 100% of the total.

Prize money in a \$250 Added Money Classic would be broken down in the same percentages as the other UPHA Classic classes, however, only \$50 would be awarded to the fourth, fifth and sixth places.

TO BE ELIGIBLE for competition in any UPHA Classic Grand Championship, a horse or pony must have place first through sixth in any UPHA Classic qualifying class, and both the owner and trainer of the entry must be an Active or Associate member of the UPHA.

Rules and Regulations

The Oshkosh Summer Classic will not assume any responsibility for damages to persons, animals, or property at the show, nor will it be liable for any accident or injury sustained by a person or animal on the show grounds at any time. In addition, it will not be responsible for any lost or damaged vehicles. Horses must be kept under control. If they are not, they may be barred from competition, and entry fees will be forfeited.

Health Certificate

All horses shipped into the State of Wisconsin must have the required health certificates issued by a veterinarian from the state or region. These must be available for inspection during the show and comply with Wisconsin State Law. Negative Coggins test required for each horse.

Vaccination Requirements

1. Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with these rules may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturer's or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter

from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management when requested.

Entries/Post Entries/Incomplete Entries

Entries close June 8, 2026. A post entry fee of \$50 per entry/horse will be levied on each entry postmarked after that date. Due to limited stall availability, entries must be received on time. A horse entered by the closing date may be entered in additional classes provided the class does not have to be divided to accommodate it. Each entry must be signed by both the exhibitor and the trainer. Post-dated checks are not acceptable. There will be a \$25 fee for all returned checks. There will be no exceptions to this rule. The show committee reserves the right to decline any entry and return the entrance fee. This committee may prohibit anyone from attending or showing a horse. It also may remove any owner, stable employee, or horse from the ring or grounds without liability.

Prize Money Distribution

All monies will be disbursed within 30 days of the close of the horse show.

Division of Classes

The show committee reserves the right to cancel a class if there are fewer than five entries and to combine or divide a class if this is in the best interest of all. Driving classes will be divided at 15. Prize money will be doubled, and separate trophies and ribbons will be distributed for divided classes. Notification of intent to divide a class will be made one hour prior to the class.

Office Hours

The office will close 1 hour before each performance. Check posted office hours for additional closings.

Registration Papers

A copy of registration papers showing proof of ownership must be presented to the show office before the show number can be

released. A photocopy of both sides of the registration paper must accompany each entry.

Open Checks

An open check must be left in the horse show office for each exhibitor participating in the horse show to cover any miscellaneous costs, including, but not limited to, class additions or additional stalls used. An open check left by a trainer covering all exhibitors under his/her responsibility will suffice for this requirement. No back numbers will be released until an open check is on file in the horse show office. If the open check is used for any additional fees, the amount of the check will be available at the close of the horse show, or an exhibitor/trainer may pick up their unused open check then. Horse show management has the right to waive this requirement as they feel is necessary.

Contact with the Judges

No exhibitor will be permitted to confer with a judge unless he/she is accompanied by a show official.

Vendors

Vendor space will be available for \$100 for the show. Please contact Lance Hayes for more information.

Refunds

Any exhibitor canceling any entry after June 15 forfeits the stall fee. No refunds will be made during the show, and no stall fees will be refunded. A championship entry must be declared and paid for in the show office before the horse will be permitted to show. This applies to stables with open checks. To be eligible to show in a stake or championship, a horse or pony must be properly entered, shown, and judged in a qualifying class in the same division. An exhibitor who qualifies more than one horse for a stake may elect to show only one horse back without penalty.

Scratches

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to scratch an entry for a class in which he or she does not intend to participate. This includes stake and championship classes. A \$25 fine will be levied for failure to scratch an entry two hours before show time, or if class split and it affects the split.

Dogs

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty.

Stabling

Stalls consist of steel with reinforced plastic walls and wood. There are stall doors. Stalls will be available on Monday afternoon. The cost of a box stall is \$175. Stalls will be assigned at the discretion of the show management. Each horse entered must have a stall. Payment for tack stalls must be received at the same time as payment of classes.

Smoking is prohibited in the barns.

Important: There will be no first-day bedding. Shavings will be available on the grounds. Boards must be ordered by June 7, 2026, to guarantee your order.

Warm-Up Area & Show Ring

A warm-up area will be provided. The covered show ring area is 150'x250'. The footing consists of sand & limestone.

Parking

Parking of trailer, campers, etc., will be directed by show management. A permit will be required to park a mobile home on the grounds. A \$50 charge per weekend will apply to this permit. Permits will be available at the horse show office.

Wisconsin Owned/Shown Classes

In order to qualify for this class, the registered owner and the exhibitor must be Wisconsin residents at the time the class is held. A "Wisconsin resident" is a person who is registered to vote in Wisconsin or qualified to register to vote in Wisconsin, and who declares Wisconsin his/her state of residence for state and federal

income tax purposes. If the registered owner is a minor, his/her custodial parent(s) must meet the above criteria. (The location where the horse is trained and/or boarded is immaterial.)

Judging

Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes.

Memberships

Owners/Trainers/Riders of American Saddlebreds must be current members of the American Saddlebred Horse and Breeders Association. Owners/Trainers of all Hackney Ponies or Horses must be a current member of the American Hackney Horse Association.

Ponies

Pony measurement cards must be available for inspection. Trainers and owners must present current copy of AHHS Membership cards.

Walk & Trot 12 and Under Exhibitors

For riders 12 years of age and under who have never been judged in a class wearing a full suit that required a canter. Walk / Trot 12 & Under exhibitors may only participate in Walk/Trot 12/Under classes offered at the show.

Combining Classes

Oshkosh Summer Classic reserves the right to combine classes of the same division based on the number of entries within a division. For example, Show Pleasure 13 & under may be combined with Show Pleasure 14-17 if there is a limited number of entries in either of the splits.

ABS Single-Bit Division

Single Bit classes are open to Amateur or Juvenile riders in a snaffle bit only (no curb bits or curb chains allowed), with a running martingale, German martingale, or draw rein. All tack should be of show-ring quality. Riders are to wear appropriate show ring attire. Horse/rider combinations may not cross-enter into another division, with the exception of the Model, Showmanship, and Pattern classes. Single Bit classes are open to Amateur or Juvenile riders in a snaffle bit only (no curb bits or curb chains allowed), with a running martingale, German martingale, or draw rein. All tack should be of show-ring quality. Riders are to wear appropriate show ring attire.

Horse/rider combinations may not cross-enter into another division, with the exception of the Model, Showmanship, and Pattern classes, unless otherwise stated in the prize list.

Elite Single Bit classes are open to both professionals and amateurs. Amateurs or Juveniles may show in both regular single-bit and elite single-bit classes at the same horse show. However, the same horse/rider combination may not compete in both the W/T and the W/T/C sections of the Single Bit division at the same horse show.

Open Breed

Classes are open to any breed of horse, rider of any age, Professional or Amateur, unless the class description specifically indicates amateur or junior exhibitor. To be shown in the appropriate attire for the division being shown in.

Classic Pleasure Horse

Classic Pleasure horses must be plain shod, rim pads or single pad (no wedges). Classic Pleasure is open to amateurs and juvenile riders and drivers only. Stallions are prohibited. Classic Pleasure horses must be plain shod - rim pads, synthetic or natural rubber, egg bar, or a single pad allowed. Wedge pads and bands are prohibited. Any motion or action resulting from shoeing is to be penalized. Entries are to be shown in a pelham or full bridle consisting of both a snaffle and curb bit and English-type saddle with a girth, unless otherwise specified in the prize list. Horses are to be shown with a full mane and tail. Not to be braided. Tail switches allowed. Informal attire is appropriate for riders in morning, afternoon, and evening classes.

Novice, Maiden, or Limit Definition

Novice, Maiden, or Limit Definition: Classes will count whether ESC-rated or not, or whether shown at "A" or "B" rated shows.

Equine Sports Council

ESC is a non-profit, non-member organization whose mission is to bring structure and knowledge to middle-market and grassroots shows, providing an opportunity for those new to the industry to compete and learn in a constructive environment, and to give experienced competitors the confidence that shows in the network will be well run.

Academy Division

The purpose of this division is to introduce potential owners to the joys of showing horses and give riders the opportunity to gain experience in a fun horse show atmosphere. The UPHA Chapters 3/4 and 10 sanction these classes. A complete copy of the guidelines for these classes will be available at the horse show office.

RIDERS: Riders in this division are students who are enrolled in a professionally operated program and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. Riders may NOT cross enter into any performance classes with the exception of driving classes. A rider who has shown in a regular division class and/or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from further participation in the Academy division, with the exception of the Open Rider Pleasure classes (if applicable).

RIDERS' ATTIRE: All riders are encouraged to use safety helmets. ASTM/SEI Approved Safety helmets are the only acceptable headgear for academy riders. Helmets are required for ALL riders 10 and under (effective 01/07). Saddle Seat Attire: Jodhpurs or dark pants, shirt with a collar, tie, jodhpur boots or sturdy shoes. Fitted vest, sweater vest or sweater permitted; no derbies/hats. No full riding suits allowed.

HORSES: Horses are to be lesson-type horses. These horses must display the characteristics of such! Instructors are encouraged to own or lease their academy horses. Horses must not be in training. Horses may be shown in a snaffle bridle with a martingale or a Pelham/full bridle. Appropriate saddles are to be used for the seat being ridden. Hoof blacking and ribbon braids are optional. Academy horses may cross-enter other divisions at any show; however, show horses may not be entered into the Academy division. This means an academy horse is allowed to show in the Academy division and be cross-entered into other divisions (such as Pleasure, Country Pleasure, Pleasure Equitation) at the same show.

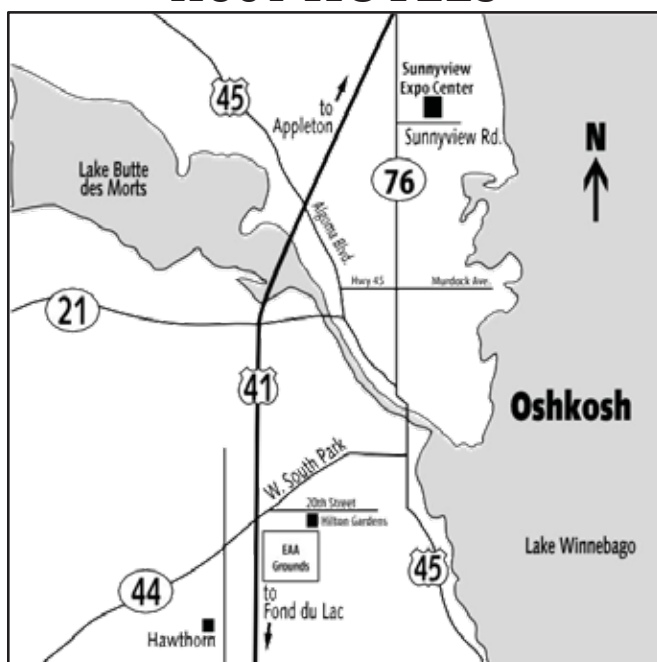
